NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.

POSTMARKS WILL BE CHECKED

1. All entries must be mailed and postmarked to:

before midnight, Monday, July 8, 2023.

All exhibitors 11 years of age and up must

pay \$14 to receive a fair pass and be eligible for prize money. For those 10 and under and those that do not wish to receive a fair pass your entry fee will be \$10 to be eligible for prize money. Passes can be picked up when your entry is made.

- 2. Open to Holmes County residents only: 18 years of age and older. Except for kid classes.
- 3. Entries must be the work of the exhibitor.
- Photos must be turned in July 16, 2023 from 1-3 pm at the Baker Building. If entering 10 or more items, please pick up your tags during this time. Please attach them to your items before you arrive Saturday August 5, 2023.
- No article can compete that has been previously exhibited at our fair.
- 6. Entrant may only enter one item in each class, but can enter as many classes as desired. You must enter at least 1 item for an exhibitor's pass.
- 7. Articles for display must be in between 8 AM and Noon on Saturday, August 5, 2023. Judging will take place later that day. No projects will be released before 8:30 AM Sunday August 13, 2023 and must be picked up by 10:00 AM. Photos must be turned in July 24th.
- 8. Pick up cakes and pies after 5 PM Saturday the day of judging, August 5, 2023.
- 9. Claim checks will be given when entry is made, and must be presented when reclaiming articles at the close of the Fair. On day of pick-up, Committee will hand you your articles at the table.
- 10. The committee reserves the right to withhold articles submitted which are not judged to be of a sufficiently high standard. Second place awards may be presented at the discretion of the judge, even though a first place in not awarded
- 11. The decision of the judges will be final.
- 12. Loitering in the building during judging and placement of displays will not be permitted.
- 13. Every precaution will be taken for the care of exhibits, but the Fairboard and chairpersons will not be responsible for any damage to or loss of property.
- 14. Any exhibits removed from building before release time, premium money will be forfeited. Release time: Sunday August 13, 2023 between 9:00 and 10:30 AM
- 15. If you have items that you signed up to bring but are unable to enter, please make a list for us so we can remove them from our list before judging begins.
- 16. Awards sponsored by Home Arts unless otherwise stated.

COOKERY AND CANNING

- 1. Place all baked goods on as small a paper plate as possible.
- 2. All entries must be wrapped in plastic wrap.
- Items entered should not be made from commercial mixes or prepared canned products.
- 4. Entrant must bring the whole pie, cake, or coffee cake, to be judged, then one piece from each will be reserved for exhibit. The rest will be released at 5:00 PM, Saturday August 5, 2023. Claim checks will be required for pick up; if not picked up, it becomes the property of the committee.
- 5. Canned foods must have been canned between August 1, 2022 and August 1, 2023 using recommended canning methods and times. (Boiling water bath for fruits, tomatoes, pickles, jams and jellies. Pressure processing for vegetables, soups and meats.)
- 6. Jams and jellies must be sealed with standard canning lids and water bath processed.
- Frozen foods including iams and iellies will be disqualified

YEAST BREAD CONTEST: CLASS YB01

EGG BREAD

This recipe will make 2 loaves.

Ingredients:

2 c. milk

¼ c. butter

¼ c. sugar

6 c. all-purpose flour, divided 2 pkgs. active dru ueast (4

½ tsp.)

1½ tsp salt

3 eggs

2-3 tbs of butter, melted for brushing on loaves when done

Instructions:

Heat milk, sugar, and butter in a microwave safe bowl until the butter begins to melt. Stir the milk should be around 115-120 degrees. This should take about 90 seconds.

In large mixing bowl combine 3 cups of the flour, yeast, and salt. Pour the milk mixture into the dry ingredients. Add eggs and mix well. Add the remaining 3 cups of flour and mix until soft dough forms. The dough will be soft and slightly stickier than other yeast bread.

Turn dough out on a lightly floured surface and knead for 3 minutes. Place dough in an oiled bowl and cover it with a damp cloth or plastic. Let rise in a warm location for 1 hour.

Punch the dough down and divide it into 2 portions. Shape each portion into a loaf shape, pinch the ends to seal, and place loaves in greased loaf pans. Cover pans with a damp cloth and allow them to rise for 35 minutes.

Bake loaves for 30 minutes at 350°.

Brush with butter and let sit in pans for 5 minutes before
