Estimated Cost of Processing

Beef	
Slaughter Fee	\$100
Live Weight	1,200 lbs. x 62% dressing percentage
Dress Weight (Hanging Weight)	744 lbs.
Basic cut & vacuum pack	\$0.60 lb.
Basic total costs	\$447 processing + \$100 kill fee = \$547

Fees in addition to those listed above: Patties \$0.50 lb., Bologna, and wieners \$1.50 lb.

For example, a 1,200 lb. steer would cost approximately \$547 to cut, wrap, and vacuum pack. With 50 lbs. made into wieners at \$1.50 per lb. it would add an additional \$75 for a total of \$622.

Pork	
Slaughter Fee	\$65
Live Weight	260 lbs. x 72% dressing percentage
Dress Weight (Hanging Weight)	187 lbs.
Basic cut & vacuum pack	\$0.60 lb.
Basic total cost	\$112 processing + \$65 kill fee = \$177

Fees in addition to those listed above:

Patties \$0.50/lb., Cured Hams and Bacons \$1.00/lb., Smoked Sausage \$1.00/lb., Stuffed Sausage Products \$1.00/lb. For example, a 260 lb. hog would cost approximately \$177 to cut, wrap and vacuum pack. By curing 2 hams at 20 lbs. / ham and 2 bacons at 10 lbs. would add an additional cost of 60 lbs. of curing expense at \$1.00/lb. for an additional cost of \$60. Add 10 lbs. of smoke sausage at \$1.00/lb. for an additional cost of \$10. Final estimated cost of \$247.

Goat and sheep are estimated at \$100 flat kill rate, cut, wrap, and freeze.

1. REGISTER AT THE BUYERS' TABLE – Buyers must register with the volunteers from Rea & Associates inside the Sale Barn to receive a buyer number. **Bidder is required to provide their driver license or state identification number on the buyer registration card; Bidder is responsible for outstanding debt of purchase(s).**

2. BID ON SELECTED ANIMAL(S) –

- **SOLD BY THE POUND:** *Steers, Dairy Feeders, Hog, and Sheep*
- **SOLD BY THE HEAD:** *Goats*
- **SOLD BY THE PEN:** *Poultry and Rabbits.*

The auctioneer and ring men will take your bids.

The winning bidder will be required to show your buyer number and STATE the DESTINATION of the animal.

3. Buyer Add-On Form – Buyers have the opportunity to add funds to a participant's project. You must register and obtain a buyer number. Forms are available at <https://holmes.osu.edu/>; or at the Clerks Table during the sale. Payment is due the night of the sale.

4. SETTLE YOUR ACCOUNT – Volunteers from The Commercial & Savings Bank clerk the sale inside the Sale Barn. **Payment and verification for shipping of livestock must be made Thursday or Friday by the close of the sale.**

Every buyer should pick up your receipts and photos of your purchases at the Clerk's table. **Payment must be made by check, as cash and credit cards will not be accepted. See insert for ACH payment option.**

Photographs – Buyers need to pick up picture(s) of livestock purchased at the sale. Pictures will be available when you check out at the Clerk's table.

Release – Livestock will be released to buyers on Sunday, August 13, 2023 at 7:00 AM and must be removed from the fairgrounds by 4:00 PM.

Processing – The following destinations are available:

The **top ten BEEF STEER, HOGS, & SHEEP will be evaluated in a carcass contest** to be held at Sugar Valley Meats on Thursday, August 17, 2023 at 5:00 PM. Resale of the carcass (beef & hog) or further processing (beef & hog) to your specifications can be arranged through the Sale Committee. An example of processing fees is included in this brochure. In lieu of resale of sheep carcass the buyer could consider donating to a local non-profit.

Resale – Buyers may consign their purchases to a commercial livestock auction "for slaughter only". Net cost in this situation will be the difference between the purchase price and the proceeds from the commercial auction less any applicable marketing fees and transportation cost. Buyers may also donate the proceeds from resale to the 4-H/FFA programs. Market livestock projects may NOT be resold in the ring and should NOT be returned to the seller. Market livestock projects ARE NOT eligible to be shown again by that exhibitor or any other member in any future Junior Market Livestock Shows. No purchases of animals which have been designated to be turned will be

permitted at the Clerk's Table. All turned animals will go to designated turn destination for resale.

Participation – Members must be present to sell their projects through the Livestock Sale unless prior arrangements have been made with the Market Livestock Sale Committee. Members who are not present when their projects sell shall forfeit any amounts received in excess of fair market value to the Holmes County Education Foundation.

RESALE: HOGS, SHEEP, GOATS & DAIRY FEEDERS

- If sent to Buyer no fees will apply. Current market prices will be posted at the registration table and at checkout on the day of sale. If an animal is sent to market, your check will reflect deductions for feed costs, trucking, and commission fees.

- **Only Grand, Reserve and top 10 of each species selling in ring**
- **Dairy & Beef Feeder – No Slaughter Option**
- **Hogs – All projects are terminal.**
- **Grand and Reserve swine, beef, and lambs WILL be slaughtered at Sugar Valley Meats.**
- **Grand and Reserve Meat & Dairy Goats must be destined for slaughter.**

Holmes Wayne Electric Co-Op - Operation

Roundup Program – This program is made up of members of the Holmes/Wayne Electric Cooperative who contribute funds for special projects in the communities they serve. This program will cover \$2,500 of processing expenses for meat (hog or beef) **donated to the Holmes County Home or the Darb Snyder Senior Center.**

Love Center Food Pantry - The Love Center Food Pantry has been the recipient of buyers donating processed meat items to the food pantry to be

distributed to the needy. This year the Love Center has funds available whereby they can help with the processing expenses, should you desire the help. Buyers wishing to take part in this program are responsible to pay the purchase price of the animal they are donating to the Love Center. Buyers will be responsible for contacting the directors of the Love Center Food Pantry at 330.674.2504 or Edgar Raber at 330.763.4757 (cell) to make arrangements for receiving help with the processing expense.

Darb Snyder Senior Center – The Darb Snyder Senior Center is asking for donations of meat, preferably beef or pork, essential for the meals provided for the Meals on Wheels program.
